Federal and State Grants Support District 113A Programs: ESEA of 1965 As Amended

Though local funds are the source for most of District 113A's operating expenses, federal and state grants also may provide funds that support programs and services in our school district. For the 2022-2023 school year, District 113A used grant funds to provide the following services and programming.

Title 1: Federal Title I, Part A, Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged Title 1 Funds: \$ 390,216 (Includes carryover from FY22 and Title 4 transfer)

District 113A is entitled to federal Title 1 grant funds for the 2022-2023 school year. These federal funds are allocated through formulas that are based primarily on census poverty estimates adjusted for the cost of education in each State. These grant funds must be used to ensure that all children have a fair, equal and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on state academic achievement standards and assessments. This year, the data analysis of our student population and free/reduced lunch enrollment found that all schools in the district qualify for Title 1 programming.

District 113A will use FY23 Title 1 grant funds to support the following personnel and activities: The federal funds will allow us to provide supplemental reading and/or math services for students who meet the criteria for the program. Parents of students who are eligible for Title 1 services will receive detailed information about the programs via email and/or other forms of communication.

Title 2: Federal Title II Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Fund (Teacher Quality) **Title 2 Funds:** \$ 37,615 Public Allocation and \$9,134 Nonpublic Allocation

The purpose of the title 2 grant is to provide funds to increase student academic achievement by elevating teacher and principal quality through recruitment, hiring, and retention strategies and to hold local educational agencies and schools accountable for improvements in student academic achievement services.

This includes professional development for teachers related to content and instructional strategies for the Common Core State Standards (English/Language Arts and Mathematics), the Next Generation Science Standards, and instructional technology.

Additionally Title 2 grant funds are dispersed to Nonpublic Schools based on enrollment data provided during a regularly scheduled consultation meeting. Therefore, professional development for non-public school teachers is included in the budget.
